Guide for Helping Patients Afford Their Medications

modified December 2025

Improving adherence has the potential to save billions of healthcare dollars. However, the inability to afford medications is a known adherence barrier. This chart includes cost-saving tips and a list of programs and resources to consider for patients. Note: list may not be all-inclusive.

Cost-Saving Tips	
Try to streamline patients' medications	Look for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • duplicates or overlapping medications or supplements that can be eliminated. • Brand-name products that can be switched to generics or therapeutic alternatives. • medications that are being used to treat preventable side effects of other meds.
Consider tablet splitting	Recommend tablet splitting when appropriate, for meds that are priced similarly between strengths.
Review quantities	Suggest purchasing larger quantities of medication at one time. A 90-day supply may cost less and reduce co-pays compared to a 30-day supply.
Consider a limited role for drug samples and co-pay coupons	Drug samples and co-pay coupons can save money upfront, but can cost patients more in the long run. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patients get stabilized on these meds, which are often more expensive. • Co-pay coupons: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ True drug co-pays may not be realized until the coupon expires, or the max amount covered by the coupon is reached. ○ Usually can't be used by patients with government-funded drug coverage (e.g., Medicare, Medicaid, TRICARE). • Save samples and coupons for meds that don't have more affordable alternatives, or for short-term meds such as antibiotics.
Consider a limited role for discount or savings cards	Discount or savings cards are typically used as an alternative to insurance , although requirements for eligibility can vary. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Money spent on Rx's using these might not be applied to the patient's deductible. • Rx's not run through insurance may skew quality measures. • Encourage patients to ask if their pharmacy has its own discount program.
Look for assistance programs	Assistance programs (e.g., state programs, drug company programs) vary and may have income requirements. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some organizations, like the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, help patients pay for treatments for specific diseases. • Note that money paid by assistance programs might not count toward the patient's deductible. • Help patients understand the fine print with any of these programs. For example, there may be expiration dates, limits on amounts, or exclusions (e.g., patients with government-funded insurance). • Some insurers deny coverage, then require the patient to use a charitable patient assistance program to pay for the med, thus shifting cost from the insurer to the charitable organization. This is called an alternate funding program. Patients enrolled in an alternate funding program may not be eligible for drug company programs.

Benefits Checkup www.benefitscheckup.org	Site provides a zip code-specific report of programs available to help reduce costs of healthcare and medication. Also includes online application for Medicare Low Income Subsidy known as Extra Help. Service provided by the National Council on Aging.

GoodRx www.goodrx.com 855-268-2822	Site allows drug price comparisons between pharmacies for a specific drug. Coupons can be texted, emailed, printed, or sent to a phone to use at participating pharmacies. Has a free app for iPhone or Android for comparing prices and getting coupons. Also includes a free discount card that can be ordered via mail and other helpful tools such as a pill identifier and savings opportunities on pet meds.

NeedyMeds www.needymeds.org 800-503-6897	Typing a drug name (brand or generic) or glucose test strip in the search box pulls up links to patient assistance programs, \$4 generics, coupons and rebates, product websites, and drug information. A list of resources by program or manufacturer name is also provided. Provides a locator for free or low-cost clinics. Information about Medicaid, Medicare, and other state assistance programs is available. Includes a free drug discount card that can be ordered by mail, downloaded and printed, or accessed on the free app for Android.
Optum Perks https://perks.optum.com	Site allows drug price comparisons between pharmacies for a specific drug and offers coupons. Can also search by condition to compare prices of common medications used to treat the condition. Coupons can be downloaded, texted, emailed, or printed to use at participating pharmacies. Also has a telemedicine portal.
RxAssist www.rxassist.org	Site provides information on patient assistance programs through manufacturer, brand, and generic drug name search. Has a patient assistance program directory (alphabetical by manufacturer name). Has FAQs about patient assistance programs and drug discount cards. Also includes a free drug discount card that can be printed from their website.
RxHope www.rxhope.com	Site provides information on patient assistance programs through brand name, manufacturer, or program name search. Has a patient assistance program directory (alphabetical by manufacturer name). Patients can use the “Patient Request” feature to review program guidelines and requirements, then complete the online or printable request form.
RxSaver www.rxsaver.com	Search for prescription coupons on the website or on the free iPhone or Android app.
SingleCare www.singlecare.com 844-234-3057	Site allows drug price comparisons between pharmacies for a specific drug. Coupon cards can be texted, emailed, or printed to use at participating pharmacies. Has a free app for iPhone or Android for comparing prices and getting coupons. There are some limitations for Medicare. Patients can subscribe to the savings newsletter.

Coupons and Rx discount card can be downloaded, texted, emailed, or printed to use at participating pharmacies. Patients can register to make a medication list, get pill and refill reminders, and access medication information. Also has health condition information. Has a free app for iPhone or Android that patients can use to get their Rx discount card, pill and refill reminders, drug interaction alerts, etc.
